PLANNING APPLICATION VALIDATED FOR THE PROPOSED 280 BERTH RIVER THAMES MARINA DEVELOPMENT ON LAND AT WHITE CROSS FARM,

WALLINGFORD, OXFORDSHIRE

London Rock Supplies Ltd and agents Greenfield Associates, the two companies involved with the plans for a dedicated offline marina development adjacent to

the River Thames, on farmland to the south of Wallingford, have reached a

crucial milestone in the proposed development.

The Planning Application - together with the Environmental Statement that

takes into account all the likely effects and mitigation identified in the

Environmental Impact Assessment – has been validated by the Oxfordshire

County Council planning department. The reference number is MW.0033/18.

The application was submitted to the planning authority in April 2018, after a

public consultation exhibition in January of this year. Around 100 people

attended the exhibition, many of them staying for around 30 minutes - and

clearly appreciating the opportunity for one on one conversations with the

landowners, the lead consultancy and specialist technical consultants.

James Jeffries, Managing Director of London Rock and Simon Rees of Greenfield

Associates felt the exhibition was a very worthwhile part of the public

consultation process. They also confirmed that feedback from the consultation

would be incorporated in to the application documents.

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"While we recognise that some people don't really like the idea of the

construction phase of the marina in their neighbourhood, it was extremely

helpful to be able to talk to local people face to face - and deal directly with

some of the misconceptions about the proposed new marina development.

"In particular, it was very useful for us to understand local views about public

access and future use of the marina."

The proposals have been amended following comments from the exhibition to

reduce the number of berths to allow for part of the marina to be dedicated to

the hire and use of non-motorised water craft such as canoes and kayaks for

the community, and the provision of a dedicated slipway and mooring for the

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club.

Simon adds,

"The application is extremely comprehensive and includes 11 specialist technical

reports. The accompanying Non-Technical Summary is available on the website

Oxfordshire County Council will now carry out its own consultation - and the

local community will have further opportunity to comment.
